### Which Word?

Book: Smell Series: My Senses Level: Pioneer

#### Objective

To help students recall key terms in a text about the sense of smell.

#### Supplies

- Several copies of the Smell book
- Which Word? worksheet (attached)
- Pencils

#### **Before the Activity**

Print a copy of the Which Word? worksheet for each student.

#### Activity

*Smell* describes what the sense of smell is and how it works. Pass out copies of this book, and ask students to read it on their own. Also pass out pencils and copies of the Which Word? worksheet. This worksheet lists several key terms related to smell. After reading the book, students should draw a line matching each term with its definition.

#### **Evaluation**

Collect the worksheets at the end of class. Use the attached answer key to give each student 1 point for each correct match, for up to 9 points total.
