Weapons Words

Book: Weapons of World War II

Series: World War II

Level: Voyager

Objective

To help students build vocabulary related to weapons and tactics used during World War II.

Supplies

- · Weapons of World War II book
- Weapons Words worksheet (attached)
- Pencils

Before the Activity

Read *Weapons of World War II* out loud as a class, or assign it to students to read on their own. Print a copy of the Weapons Words worksheet for each student.

Activity

Pass out the Weapons Words worksheet. Explain that it lists terms related to important weapons or tactics described in the *Weapons of World War II* book. Students should use what they remember from their reading to match each term from the column on the left to its description in the column on the right. Because each term will be used only once, students can use the process of elimination to help figure out the answers. They can also look back through the *Weapons of World War II* book if they get stuck.

Evaluation

Collect the worksheets and use the attached answer key to give each student 1 point for each correct answer, for up to 16 points.

Standards

This lesson may be used to address the Common Core State Standards' reading standards for informational text, grades 6-7 (RI 6.4, 7.4), and language standards, grades 6-7 (L 6.4, 7.4).
