## **Lesson Plan**

### The Truth About Centipedes

Book: Centipedes Series: Bugs Level: Pioneer

#### **Objective**

To have students practice identifying true and false statements based on information from a text about centipedes.

### **Supplies**

- Several copies of the Centipedes book
- The Truth About Centipedes worksheet (attached)
- Pencils

### **Before the Activity**

Divide the class into pairs, and print a copy of the worksheet for each pair. Read *Centipedes* out loud, or assign it to students to read on their own.

### **Activity**

Divide students into their pairs. Give each pair a worksheet and a copy of the *Centipedes* book. Explain that the worksheet has several sentences about centipedes. Some are true, but others are false. Students should use the information from the book to determine whether each sentence is correct. If a sentence is true, they should write the letter T in the blank beside it. If a sentence is false, they should write an F. Remind students to pay attention to fact boxes and infographics in addition to the book's main text.

#### **Evaluation**

Collect the worksheets at the end of class. Use the attached answer key to give each pair 1 point for each correct answer, for up to 12 points total.

#### **Standards**

This lesson may be used to address the Common Core State Standards' reading standards for informational text, grade 2 (RI 2.4, 2.5).
