Presidential Problem-Solving

Book: *Theodore Roosevelt* **Series:** Influential Presidents **Level:** Beacon

Objective

To help students find and cite key details in a nonfiction text about Theodore Roosevelt.

Supplies

- Several copies of the *Theodore Roosevelt* book
- Presidential Problem-Solving worksheet (attached)
- Pencils

Before the Activity

Print a copy of the Presidential Problem-Solving worksheet for each student.

Activity

Theodore Roosevelt was one of the most influential presidents in US history. He impacted the country in many ways. In this activity, students will explore some of the ideas and actions he's known for.

To start, pass out the Presidential Problem-Solving worksheet and explain that it contains questions about the *Theodore Roosevelt* book. Students should look for answers as they read through this book. Under each question, they should write both the answer and the page number where they found it.

Evaluation

Collect the worksheets and use the attached answer key to give students 1 point for each correct answer and 1 point for including the page number where they found it, for up to 24 points.

Standards

This lesson may be used to address the Common Core State Standards' reading standards for informational text, grade 4 (RI 4.1), and writing standards, grade 4 (W 4.8).
