Synonym Sort

Book: Helicopters
Series: Let's Fly
Level: Beacon

Objective

To help students practice distinguishing shades of meaning among synonyms.

Supplies

- Helicopters book
- Whiteboard
- 3 copies of the Scholastic Children's Dictionary
- Timer

Before the Activity

Read *Helicopters* out loud to students, pausing on the last two pages (pp. 26–27).

Activity

Pages 26 and 27 of the *Helicopters* book describe the instruments that help helicopters fly and avoid crashes. Write the word *avoid* on the whiteboard at the front of the class. Then open the Scholastic Children's Dictionary to page 771, the first page of the thesaurus feature. Explain that a thesaurus is a tool that lists synonyms, or words with similar meanings. Explain that although the meanings are similar, they are not identical. For example, choose a student to look up the word *avoid* in the thesaurus and read the list of synonyms out loud: *dodge*, *evade*, *duck*, and *sidestep*. Each of these words refers to getting away from something. But each word has a slightly different meaning. *Dodge* is more related to moving quickly, while *evade* is more related to being clever. Writers use thesauruses to find words with the exact meaning they want to use.

To help students practice identifying these slight differences in meaning, divide the class into three teams. Give each team a copy of the Scholastic Children's Dictionary. Explain that you will read a sentence out loud. Then you will read a list of three synonyms. Students have 30 seconds to determine which synonym is the best match for how the word is used in the particular sentence. If needed, students can use the dictionary to look up definitions of unfamiliar words. When the timer is up, call on a student from each team to give that team's answer. Then reveal the correct answer. Each team that chose this answer gets one tally mark on the whiteboard.
