### **Lesson Plan**

#### **Chick Characteristics**

**Book:** Chicks

Series: Animal Babies

Level: Scout

#### **Objective**

To help students find key details in a text about chicks.

#### **Supplies**

- Chicks book
- Chick Characteristics worksheet (attached)
- Pencils

#### **Before the Activity**

Read the *Chicks* book out loud to students. Print a copy of the Chick Characteristics worksheet for each student.

#### **Activity**

Give each student a copy of the Chick Characteristics worksheet. Explain that this worksheet has a list of facts about chicks. But each fact is missing a word. Students should use the *Chicks* book to find the missing word and write it in the blank. Each word in the box at the top of the worksheet will be used just once.

#### **Evaluation**

Collect the worksheets and use the attached answer key to give students 1 point for each correct answer, for a total of up to 8 points.

#### **Standards**

This lesson may be used to address the Common Core State Standards' reading standards for informational texts, grade 1 (RI 1.5), and the National Science Education Standards' Content Standard C, grades K–4.
