

Lesson Plan

Eagle or Eaglet?

Book: *Eaglets*

Series: Animal Babies

Level: Scout

Objective

To help students find or remember specific details from a book.

Supplies

- *Eaglets* book
- Eagle or Eaglet? worksheet (attached)
- Pencils

Before the Activity

Read the *Eaglets* book out loud to students. Print a copy of the Eagle or Eaglet? worksheet for each student.

Activity

Give each student a copy of the Eagle or Eaglet? worksheet. Explain that this worksheet has a list of phrases about eaglets and adult eagles. Students should use the *Eaglets* book to identify whether a phrase is talking about eaglets, adult eagles, or both. They should write the answer in the space next to each phrase.

Evaluation

Collect the worksheets and use the attached answer key to give students 1 point for each correct answer, for a total of up to 8 points.

Standards

This lesson may be used to address the Common Core State Standards' reading standards for informational texts, grade 1 (RI 1.1, RI 1.3), and the National Science Education Standards' Content Standard C, grades K–4.
