

## Lesson Plan

### Wind Words Worksheet

**Book:** *Wind*

**Series:** Weather

**Level:** Scout

### Objective

To help students find or remember specific details from a book.

### Supplies

- *Wind* book
- Wind Words worksheet (attached)

### Before the Activity

Read the *Wind* book out loud to students. Print a copy of the Wind Words worksheet for each student.

### Activity

Give each student a copy of the Wind Words worksheet. Explain that this worksheet has a list of facts about wind. But each fact has a missing word. Students should use the *Wind* book to find the missing word and write it in the blank. Each word in the box at the top of the worksheet will be used just once.

### Evaluation

Collect the worksheets and give students 1 point for each correct answer, for a total of up to 8 points.

### Standards

This lesson may be used to address the Common Core State Standards' reading standards for informational texts, grade 1 (RI 1.5), and the National Science Education Standards' Content Standard D, grades K–4.
