Lacrosse History

Book: Women in Lacrosse **Series:** She's Got Game

Level: Navigator

Objective

To help students demonstrate comprehension of key details from a text about the history of lacrosse.

Supplies

- Women in Lacrosse book
- Pencils and paper

Before the Activity

Read through the *Women in Lacrosse* book, or assign it to students to read on their own.

Activity

People have been playing lacrosse for hundreds of years. Today, students will explore how the sport has grown and changed over time. Divide the students into two teams. Have each team choose a scribe to write the numbers 1 through 21 on a piece of paper. Explain that for each number, you will read a statement about hockey out loud. Students in each group will work together to guess if the statement is true or false. Use the following list of statements, but don't reveal the answers until the end of the activity:
