Lesson Plan

Map Words

Book: *Reading a Map* Series: Life Skills Level: Pioneer

Objective

To help students determine the meaning of words in a text.

Supplies

- Reading a Map
- Map Words Worksheet (attached)
- Pens and pencils

Before the Activity

Read through the *Reading a Map* book, or assign it to students to read on their own. Print a Map Words Worksheet for each student.

Activity

After reading the book, each student should complete the Map Words Worksheet. Students should write each word from the word bank underneath the definition that describes it. If students get stuck, they can look back through the book for clues.

Give students several minutes to fill in their answers. Then, go through the worksheet answers as a class. Use the attached answer key to read the correct answers aloud, and ask students to grade their own work. Then collect the worksheets at the end of class.

Evaluation

Use the attached answer key to give students 1 point for each correct answer, or up to 8 points total.
