Lesson Plan

Prefix Practice

Book: Unicorns Series: Mythical Creatures Level: Beacon

Objective

To help students practice identifying and comparing prefixes.

Supplies

- Unicorns book
- Prefix Practice Word List (attached)
- Hat or bowl
- Whiteboard
- Timer

Before the Activity

Print the Prefix Practice Word List and cut it apart so each word is on a separate slip of paper. Place all the slips in a hat or bowl.

Activity

Read through the *Unicorns* book with students, or assign it to them to read on their own. Explain that the word *unicorn* comes from two Latin words. The word *uni* means "one," and the word *cornu* means "horn." Together, these two parts give the word *unicorn* its meaning. The first part ("uni-") is a prefix. A prefix is a letter or group of letters that can be added to the front of a word. The prefix changes the meaning of the base word, or root word. Many words use the same prefix. For example, the words *unicycle*, *uniform*, and *unison* also use the prefix "uni-." As a result, these words all share similar meanings. A unicycle has one wheel, a uniform is one outfit that is worn by many people, and unison means "all at once."

The English language has many common prefixes. Write the following list on the whiteboard:

- inter-
- re-
- over-
- dis-
- hyper-
- im-
- pre-

- un-
- micro-
- tele-
- trans-
- in-
- de-
- mis-

To help students practice identifying prefixes, play the following game. Have each student draw a word from the hat or bowl. When you say "Go," you will start the timer. As quickly as possible, all students should stand up and try to find another student whose word has the same prefix. Students with matching prefixes should link arms. Once all students have paired up, stop the timer and record the time. Have students in each pair read their words out loud to the class.

Then play the game again. This time, students should try to find another student who has the same root word as their word. Once students have found each other and linked arms, stop the timer and have students in each pair read their words out loud to the class.

Evaluation

Use the attached answer key to check students' answers after each round.
