Ducks in a Row

Book: *Duck Hunting* **Series**: The Outdoors **Level**: Navigator

Objective

To help students arrange steps in a process in chronological order and practice using temporal words and phrases to signal the sequence of events.

Supplies

- Duck Hunting book
- Ducks in a Row worksheet (attached)

Before the Activity

Read through the *Duck Hunting* book, or assign it to students to read on their own. Print a Ducks in a Row worksheet for each student.

Activity

Give each student a Ducks in a Row worksheet. The sentences on this worksheet describe a duck-hunting trip that a fictional boy named Trevor took last summer. But they are all out of order. Students should number the sentences to put them in the most logical order. Remind students to read through all of the sentences before they begin numbering.

After students have numbered the sentences, they should write out the sentences in paragraph form, adding transitional words and phrases to make the order clear and to improve the flow of the narrative.

Evaluation

Using the attached answer key, give students one point for each sentence they order correctly and up to 10 points for adding good transitional words and phrases to their paragraph.

Standards

This lesson may be used to address the Common Core State Standards' language standards, grade 3 (L 4.3) and writing standards, grade 3 (W 3.3).
